Real Talk~From Pastor Kathy

People younger than me have an expression they use these days: “real talk.” Real talk, as opposed to small talk, is conversation or writing that gets right to the point with no fussing around. I’d like to share some real talk with you in this article. Normally, as the new pastor I would ease into sharing the information below, but we don’t have time for such small talk. It’s got to be real talk, right now.

The situation we find ourselves in is that United Methodist ministry in Idaho Falls has reached a crossroads. If we continue to do what we are doing, *and nothing else*, there will be no United Methodist ministry in Idaho Falls in just a few years. I won’t list a bunch of statistics here (please come to the Aug. 10 meeting to hear the details) but the truth is our congregations do not have a lot of time left to continue the ministry they are engaged in right now. The advanced age of our congregants, and the lack of people under 40 years of age, are the most obvious signs that we are facing shortened lifespans as viable churches. Less obvious is the fact that our ways of expressing of the Christian faith are no longer relevant to our neighbors. I see already how important Sunday morning worship is for the folks who attend our worship services. However, our neighbors are not joining us because they don’t want to join us. They don’t have the desire to express and fulfill their spiritual needs the way we do. Singing hymns, absorbing lectures on scripture passages, and partaking in communion rituals are strange, uninteresting customs to them. Here’s the hard truth: *all the people who want our kind of Christianity are already participating in our church ministries. Our congregations are not going to get any bigger.* No advertising campaign, no charismatic young

pastor, no aftermath of a horrible national tragedy will bring more people into our churches to worship as we do, or study the Bible as we do, or participate in charity projects like we do. We are it. And we are no spring chickens.

Our situation is not unique. Indeed, most of our UM churches in the greater northwest area face the same reality we do. Aging congregations, and older, irrelevant (to younger folks) expressions of Christianity mean most of our churches are on a path toward closure. The question before us is, if we can’t “grow” our existing congregations, can we develop new ministries that are relevant to our neighbors, making the love and grace of God that already is present in our neighborhoods more visible and real?

Please hear me clearly: **one** facet of our future as United Methodists in Idaho Falls is the ministry of care and support for the saints of our churches. Our saints have given their time, energy and resources to the ministries of our churches for decades, and we must provide them with the care and support they need in the latter part of their lives. This is the Christian thing to do.

However, this cannot be the main or only ministry we engage in. God is calling us to be and do more. This year we are going to explore, experiment, and research new forms of ministry that might lead us into our new future. We will start by meeting our neighbors. Not to ask them to come to “our” church, but to find out what God is doing in their lives. We want to partner with God in whatever God’s new plans are for folks in Idaho Falls. Sounds scary, right? It is. But with God’s help, all things are possible. I think this is enough “real talk” for now. May God strengthen us for the journey ahead.

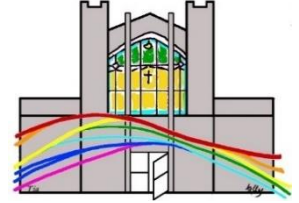
Trinity has had a long tradition of assisting with scholarships. Please give what you can to the fund so these youths can have a life-changing experience. We will continue to accept donations through the summer.

Homeless Services

In June there were 145 homeless services supplied in the 17 days we were open. This represented services to 51 unique persons. The services provided included 118 showers, 38 loads of laundry, and 15 requests for supplies. The supplies included emergency food, hygiene kits, sleeping bag, socks, underwear, gas, mail and computer use. The clients ranged in age from 18 to 74 with an average age of 44.7. Time in the church varied from 1 min to 170 minutes with an average of 38 minutes. 17 visitors were new clients for us. 72% have cellphones and 88% had valid ID.

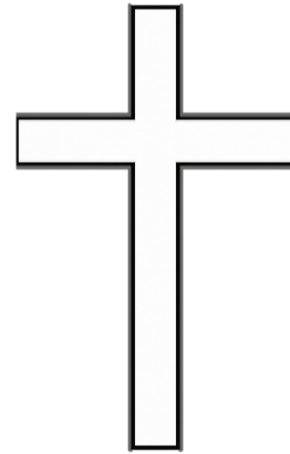
Dear Kathy & Mark Borland and all
