RCCM February Committee Reports:

<u>FISH</u> - 28 client families were served in January; for the 2015-2016 school year, 813 supply orders have been filled. FISH is expanding the amount of cleaning supplies that they will stock (such items are not covered under the food stamp program).

<u>GREATEST NEEDS</u>: Scientific calculators and headsets (contact FISH for type and cost range).

<u>Community Food Basket</u> - 869 families (2924 individuals) were served in January. The Food Basket is working with the LDS community to coordinate food drives.

Little Church in the Pines: The funding for the new well has been completed: \$12,000!

Other Business:

<u>Lenten Series offering</u>: \$200 will be given to the interfaith committee planning for Senior Baccalaureate services; the remainder will fund the joint Vacation Bible School being offered by several RCCM member churches.

<u>Vacation Bible School</u>: the joint VBS being offered by several RCCM member churches will be held July 15 - 17 at Sunnyside (Mel Erickson) Park, near EIRMC.

Soup Kitchen: All teams currently in place; numbers were down in January due to weather.

<u>Homeless Stand Down</u>: numbers down this year; heavy snow the night before made reaching the event difficult for many. It is also believed that the improving economy is helping. The take-away food items were provided by private donations and the Community Food Basket.
