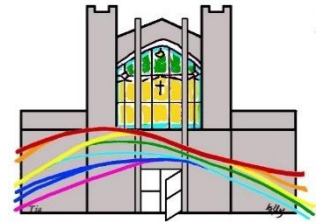

Dear Siblings in Christ,

What does success look like? I have struggled mightily with this question in the past few months. What does it mean for Trinity to be successful? Usually there would be numbers that would point toward success. Right now, we can’t measure favorable outcomes by counting people in the pews, how many home visits the pastor makes, or even by how much money arrives in the mail. There are so many variables that affect any of those numbers.

Here is what success at Trinity looked like this week:

Last Friday evening I got a call from an adult child of a long-time congregant. “Mom is under hospice care, and we are trying to do whatever would make mom happy, can you come visit her?” Of course, the answer was yes! I was so glad to be able to make a pastoral call to a nursing home for the first time in many months. Once I was screened and through the front door, I even visited two more folks whom I have been holding in prayer but had not been able to lay eyes on for nearly a year. Visiting folks under hospice care is always a difficult blessing to accept. This time it was a clear success.

You might remember that several weeks ago, Trinity received \$1,000 from the Annual Conference to purchase a gas card to keep on file down at Common Cents. This week, there were three separate people that Trinity gifted with gasoline to get them to work. Why is that notable? Because if you miss work, you get fired and are no longer able to support your family. The only other help for fuel is available one time each year, but sometimes you need help a second or third time. I count it as success that those three people still have jobs.

Tuesday was a cold day, too cold for the gentleman who showed up wearing a tennis shoe on one foot and a Nike slip-on sandal on the other. He did not have a coat or gloves. He was totally unprepared for the weather. By the time he left Trinity, he had eaten a hot meal, was warm again, and had a coat, boots and gloves to wear. *And you, Trinity, fed and clothed him!*

Remember, beloved of God, that you are loved and appreciated. There are not enough words to express all the good you are doing. Trinity remains the Body of Christ even when we are separated in order to stay safe.

Beloved in Christ I write to you today with two announcements that will impact the Greater Northwest Area of The United Methodist Church this year.

On Epiphany, I requested voluntary retirement as a bishop in The United Methodist Church, effective December 31, 2021. Today, I share this news with you.

It seems too early to announce my retirement long before it arrives, but the many steps that proceed the assignment of a new bishop demand it. This is truer this year, with denominational strife, the ongoing pandemic, and the financial consequences of each creating additional uncertainty for our United Methodist connection.

While I regret that my retirement may add to the burden of others, I am convinced that this is the right time and the right action for me personally. I will continue to work diligently with conference leaders through the year to prepare for whatever and whoever comes next. And I trust that God continues to move in the hearts of the faithful to raise up leaders for the next stage of the journey.

The other news I share is less personal but will impact us all the same.

Given the continuing presence of COVID-19 in our communities, we now expect to hold Annual Conference 2021, once again, remotely online.

While a date change is possible, please continue to hold the announced dates, June 9-12, 2021, as we explore alternative possibilities – including multiple virtual sessions. We expect to know more soon as decisions are made about plans for delayed general and jurisdictional conferences.

We'll let members of each Annual Conference know more information as it becomes available.



Despite the many challenges and transitions life brings, in faith, we know that love lives on. Please know that I continue to hold the people and ministries of the Greater Northwest Area in my prayers as we witness this truth together, though still apart from one another.

## Holy Communion for the Sage District

**First Wednesday of each month, beginning March 3 at 7 p.m. MST / 6 p.m. PST**

We have not been able to celebrate Holy Communion in our local church buildings since March 2020, but that does not mean that this sacrament is unavailable to us.

Our Western Jurisdiction bishops recognized last March that we needed a way to celebrate Holy Communion even while church buildings were closed, and physical distancing was necessary. (You can read the WJ bishops' statement here.). Those safety measures are still needed, and this prolonged departure from most everything that we previously considered "normal" has led to us needing more grace than usual. Many of our local congregations are celebrating Holy Communion online but Zoom permits us to gather (virtually) from all parts of the district to share the liturgy and sacrament together.

Anyone in the Sage District who would like to participate is invited to join a Zoom communion service the first Wednesday of every month, beginning in February 2021. Zoom allows for participation through phone and internet, and it is the same technology used for all of our charge conferences this past fall. To participate, have bread (or an equivalent, such as tortillas) and grape juice (or wine) prepared and within reach, then connect to Zoom using the link below.

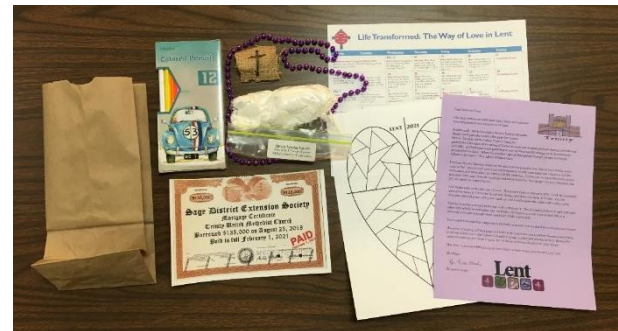
DS Rev. Karen Hernandez will lead us in the liturgy, and we will feast together on the bread of life and the cup of love.

## EIPH COVID-19 Vaccine Scheduling Update<sup>(2)</sup>

Eastern Idaho Public Health update

**Wednesday, February 3, 2021:**

On February 1, individuals aged 65 and older became eligible to receive COVID-19 vaccine in Idaho. There are over 30,000 people in the 65 and older age group in Eastern Idaho Public Health’s (EIPH) eight-county region (Bonneville, Clark, Custer, Fremont, Jefferson, Lemhi, Madison, and Teton Counties). At the present time, there are approximately 2,500 doses of vaccine allocated to nearly [40 provider locations](#) throughout the region weekly; and unfortunately, the demand for the vaccine far exceeds our current supply of vaccine.

In an effort to make the process for obtaining an appointment as simple as possible and to provide equitable distribution of vaccine to all individuals desiring it in Idaho’s current [priority groups](#), EIPH will assign available vaccination appointments randomly to all individuals who register on our waiting list **BEFORE** Thursday, February 11, 2021 at 8:00 a.m. Over the course of the following 10 days, appointments will be assigned to individuals and **EIPH WILL CALL OR TEXT TO INFORM INDIVIDUALS OF THEIR APPOINTMENT**, which could range from February 15 through the end of March. *To allow us time to make all these notifications, we would ask that you NOT call our office before February 22 to check on your appointment.* Thank you for your patience with this process.

If you register on the waiting list **AFTER** February 11 at 8:00 a.m., you can expect a call or text from EIPH between February 22-26 to notify you of your assigned appointment. Again, please do not call our office before this time, as we will have not yet made your appointment.

### Do you have plans for your stimulus money? <sup>(P)</sup> – Ruth Marsh

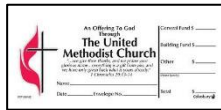

### LESSON FROM THE CHRISTIAN SCRIPTURES - Mark 9:2-9

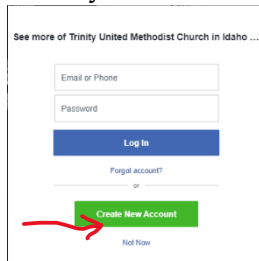
## How to Watch on Facebook

### Watching Trinity Worship Video Without a F.B. Account. <sup>(P)</sup>

Yes, you can watch Trinity Sunday morning worship video without a Facebook account.

#### ON THE LAPTOP:

1. go to GOOGLE CHROME web browser and type in:
2. <https://www.facebook.com/TUMCIF/>
3. The Trinity Facebook page comes up and you can see the video.
4. Then a Facebook "sign on" window comes up
5. At the bottom of the Sign on Window there was a "NOT NOW" button
6. Push that button and you are free to watch the live stream on a laptop without a Facebook account.



8. You can see the video on the screen and play it by pressing the play triangle
9. It only shows the latest videos.
10. If you press SHOW ALL you can see all the videos back to March.
11. You are free to watch the live stream on an iPhone without a Facebook account.

#### ON THE CELL PHONE: <sup>(P)</sup>

1. go to web browser and type in:

3. The Trinity Facebook page comes up and you can see the video.
4. Then a Facebook sign on window came up
5. Using your finger scroll down the screen
6. A second Facebook sign on window comes up
7. Close that 2nd window by pressing the "X" box up in the top right corner
