## News Update for July 16, 2020

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Since last Friday when the Trinity B & B closed for overnight stays, things have been quite different at church, and much the same. I have missed having the guys here most of the time and the community which that facilitated, however, days are still remarkably busy helping folks. Most of the guys who were B & B guests still need the services that you make possible for Trinity to provide, such as meals, showers, laundry, and the pastor's time.

In the past few days, I have spent MANY hours with someone (I'm going to call him Sam) who had been self-medicating for years with meth for Adult Attention Deficit Disorder. You might wonder how so much of my time was involved. Sam had a small window of time when he was willing to ask for help, and the clock was ticking since it was already late afternoon. I, along with a driver, took him to the Emergency Room (because that is the only place that will take out-of-state Medicaid) where we could take care of a small medical problem and get access to a social worker. Our next stop was the Crisis Center, for more time with a social worker who specializes in drug abuse and mental health issues. She wrote a map for us to follow the next day that

included how to get an Idaho Medicaid card over the phone, and which urgent care facility to visit. It was past 10:30 pm by the time my driver and I returned Sam to his tent for the night.

The next morning was filled with phone calls to Medicaid, a prospective employer, and a counselor. By 11 am we had an Idaho Medicaid number in hand, and it was time to head to an urgent care. There was a short side trip to the hand doctor to get *my* finger re-bandaged, and then it took visits to 3 different urgent care facilities before we could find someone who, took Medicaid, and was able to prescribe the drugs Sam needed. When we arrived at the pharmacy, they informed us that the drug which had been prescribed was locked in a safe which had a timer on it. We would have to return after waiting for at least an hour. Monday evening my driver and I were able to return Sam to his tent by 7 pm after picking up some dinner.

Day 3 involved a late afternoon trip to Rehabilitative Health Services for a new prescription and an additional map of steps toward sobriety for Sam now that he had access to medical care and was not illegally self-medicating. Again, you might wonder why so much of my time was involved. Sam needed to have his hand held, figuratively and literally, in order to keep things together long enough to jump through these 1,000 hoops. He needed to have someone sitting beside him who people would not just dismiss without first listening to the whole story. He needed a cheerleader and someone he could cry in front of. He needed solid pastoral care and love, not based on a judgment of worthiness but based on the teachings of Christ.

Thank you, Trinity, for being the awesome and caring congregation that you are!

Remember that I am available to you by phone or in person (with careful physical distancing and face mask) at just about any time. Please let me know if you would like to stop by for an in-person visit.

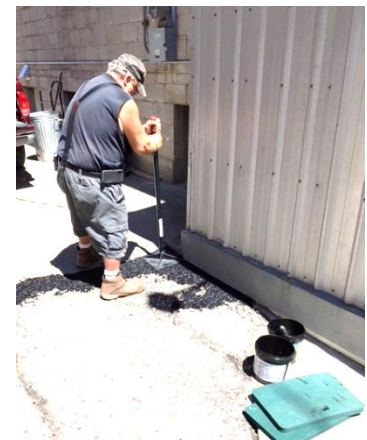

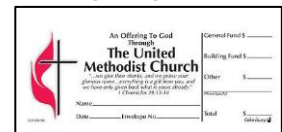

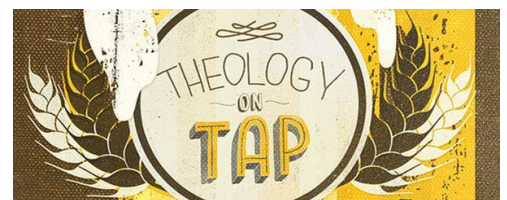
