Luke 19:1-10

Don't forget Toytopia at the Museum of Idaho. Fun for everyone.

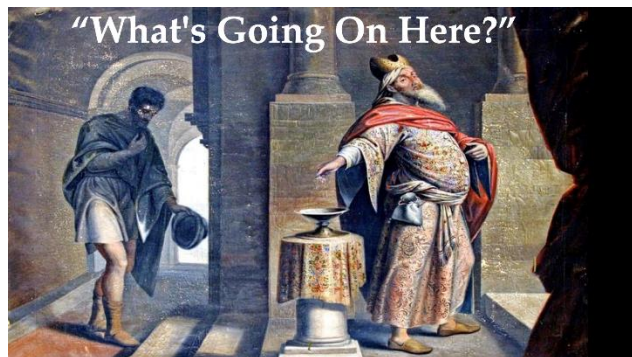
The UWF library is in the church parlor. Lots of wonderful inspiring books to read. Your completed book list is due in January.

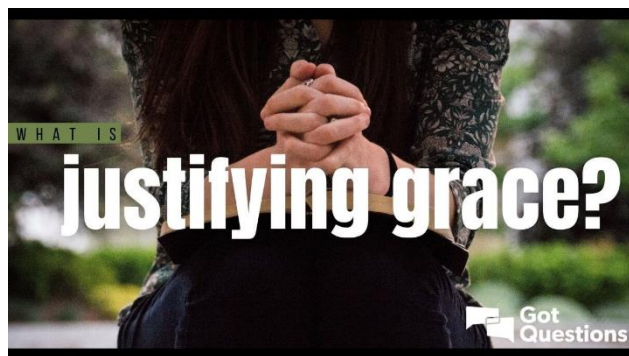
Last Week's Sermon 10/23

Theme: "Things Aren't Always What They Look Like"

Sermon: "What's Going On Here?" based on Luke 18:9-14



I wanted you to hear today's Gospel lesson from the Message translation because it helps us just how full of himself the Pharisee was. However, besides being about hubris, is story also about Justifying Grace. In the NRSV, that verse about who went home "right with God", verse 14, is translated as: I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other, for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."



So what is Justifying Grace? What's going on here? "Justification is another word for

pardon," John Wesley writes in a sermon called The Scripture Way of Salvation. "It is the forgiveness of all our sins; and, what is necessarily implied therein, our acceptance with God."

An important aspect of Justifying Grace is the ah-ha moment that often comes with it.

— Oh, God really does love me, even if I mess up sometimes, and God is willing to give me a fresh start so I can live a new life as the whole, beloved, person God designed me to be. That's why Justification is sometimes referred to as "saving" grace. Some of you may have encountered being asked if you are "saved", but the idea of being saved can mean many things because that kind of grace can happen all at once, or you may experience it bit by bit throughout your life — or both.

Left Justified The text is in line with the left-hand margin.	Right Justified The text is in line with the right-hand margin.
Center Justified The text is centered between the left and right margins. Balanced text, but ragged edges.	
Full Justification The text is evenly distributed to be in line with both the left and right margins. This provides nice edges to the text, but can create uneven spacing.	

So it can be difficult to get a handle on what Justification with God is. The Rev. Gary Henderson from United Methodist Communications says: "When I hear that term, 'justifying grace,' I feel as though I'm in a courtroom. It sounds like a legal term but it's not as difficult a term as it seems. Justifying grace helps me to know, helps us to know, that we are forgiven. It helps us to know that we are whole. It is the grace that restores us. The image I have sometimes is, I'm sitting at a typewriter. I'm typing and

the words and the lines are all over the page. And I look at it and it looks like a mess. And with a keystroke or two, I can bring it all together and order it and align it. They call it justifying to the left and to the right, or to the center. It makes sense. Sometimes it seems as though our lives are in pieces. We need a sense of order.



Now that we've made a sense of order out of Justifying Grace, let's take a look at what's going on here in today's scripture that might not be quite so obvious at a glance. First of all, Jesus is telling this story to folks who would more closely identify themselves with the Pharisee (a "good" person) rather than the tax collector (a "sinner"). Jesus does not seem to be objecting to the religious practices that the Pharisee employs — fasting twice a week and tithing on his entire income. Then, as now, faithful people's actions and resources are the hands and feet of God to bring God's grace into the world.

It is the Pharisee's arrogance and misjudgment of God's love for the tax collector that seems to be the point of Jesus telling this story. Perhaps we can get a better idea of what's going on here if we take time to consider that "Things Aren't Always What They Look Like." The Pharisee believed that if he looked like he

was doing the right thing, God would reward him with what we might call salvation. However, I believe that God does not judge us on appearances; God is interested in our heart. This story should lead us to remember that the conceit of judging others with our human eyes damages the one who jumps to conclusions, and those who may have been misjudged. By another name, it's sin, or separation from God, which brings us back to who was made right with God. It's easy to misjudge others when we misjudge what is most important to God regarding our intentions or actions. Whenever that happens, it's a good opportunity to stop and ask, "what's going on here?"

Have you been misjudged?

What did it feel like?

Perhaps you have at some time experienced the pain of this separation from God. Can you think of a time that you got misjudged? What did it feel like? What do you think that happened to bring about that misjudgment?

While you're thinking, let me share my experience with "Things Aren't Always What They Look Like"

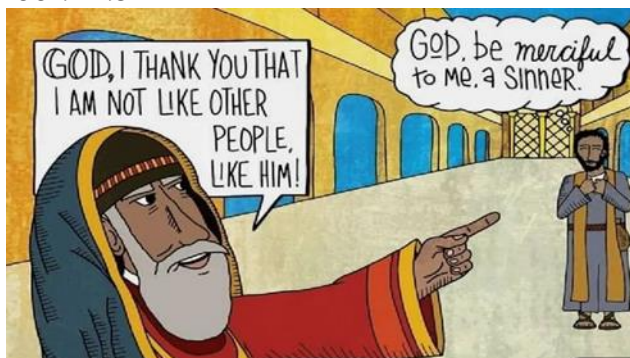
People often misjudge me. If the first thing they learn about Ruth Marsh is the fact that I am a pastor, much of the time that tiny piece of information leads people not to be their authentic self with me. They suffer

while trying to create a persona that they believe will be acceptable to me, and I suffer, because I don't get to build a genuine relationship with them. Sometimes they relive hurt done to them in the context of church and may project blame on me.

Was there an occasion that came to mind for you? Hold on to that, consider it further this week.

Have you misjudged someone else?
What did it feel like?

Now let's deal with maybe an even more important question. When was a time you misjudged someone else? What did it feel like? What do you think that happened to bring about that misjudgment? Is it possible that things aren't always what they look like?"



"Two men went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee, the other a tax man. The Pharisee posed and prayed like this: 'Oh, God, I thank you that I am not like other

people – robbers, crooks, adulterers, or, heaven forbid, like this tax man. I fast twice a week and tithe on all my income.' "Meanwhile the tax man, slumped in the shadows, his face in his hands, not daring to look up, said, 'God, give mercy. Forgive me, a sinner.'"

Jesus commented, "This tax man, not the other, went home made right with God. If you walk around with your nose in the air, you're going to end up flat on your face, but if you're content to be simply yourself, you will become more than yourself."



You are beloved by God, not because you are capable of looking good in the eyes of humans, but because of your intrinsic value to God. Your neighbor, who may feel like they need to slump in the shadows with their head in their hands, is also loved by God. That's what's going on here. Amen.

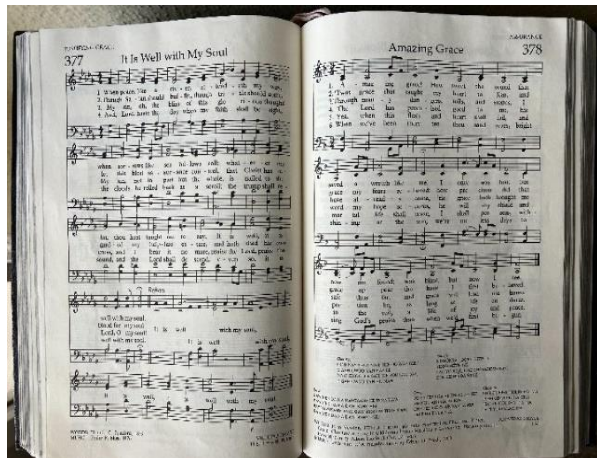
