Worship Plans for 4/9

Theme for the day: This Is The Day Sermon: A New Sunrise for a New World Focus Scripture: Matthew 28:1-10

Then, on the first day of the week following the Day of Resting, as the sun began to rise, Strong Tears (Mary) of the village of Creator's High Lodge (Magdala) and Brooding Tears (Mary) went to see the burial cave.

Suddenly the earth began to shake, and a spirit-messenger from the spirit-world above came down from the sky, walked to the burial cave, rolled the stone away — and sat down on it! He was shining as bright as a flash of lightning, and his regalia was pure white like freshly fallen snow.

The soldiers staggered back, trembling with fear, and fell to the ground like dead men.

"Do not fear!" the spirit-messenger said to the women. "The one you are looking for is not here. Creator Sets Free (Jesus), who was killed on the cross, has come back to life again—just as he said. Look! Here is where they laid him. Now hurry and go tell his followers that he has risen from the dead. Tell them he is going ahead of them to Circle of Nations (Galilee), and they will see him there. Now remember what I have told you!"


Homeless Services

In February Trinity provided services to 65 homeless persons visiting. That included 64 showers, 7 loads of laundry, and supplies. The supplies included dog food, gloves, hygiene kit, blanket, socks, underwear, haircut, and bulk drinking water. Because some of the people came by more than once during the month there were 16 unique people served during the month. The average age of the visitors was 43 years old with



the range from 18 to 69. The nominal time spent in the church was 30 minutes with a range of 5 minutes to 2 hours.

Hi, all. I'm wondering if spring is ever going to arrive. I need to rake up all the leaves that





Stained-Glass Window Repair

Last week our stained-glass windows were being traced, characterized, and documented. This week they have been soaking in water in perpetration for disassembly and cleaning of the glass. In the picture notice the beautiful watermelon colored glass that had been used in repairing a broken panel. If you compare the two panels you can see that when they installed the watermelon glass they omitted the small square of glass that defined the corner of the window. This will be corrected in the restoration. The watermelon glass will be replaced with custom made glass that matches the original glass.
