Ruth has had several conversations with Brenda in which she learned about both Trinity and the mission field of

Idaho Falls and tells me that she and her husband, David, are thrilled to be a part your church and the Idaho Falls community.

I trust that God will bless you through the gift of Ruth even as you have been blessed through Brenda's ministry. I join you in offering my prayers for Brenda as she moves into this new ministry setting. I pray for you as you say goodbye to her and her family and as you await news of your new pastor. It is my hope that you find ways to celebrate the gifts that Brenda has brought to you even as you prepare to welcome a new pastor into your midst.

Know my deep appreciation for your church and the ministry you are doing in the Idaho Falls community and know that my prayers are with you.

Good news from FISH: a grant of \$3400 was received from Breaking Boundaries to be used for the calculators and thumb drives requested in school supply lists. During the 2013-2014 school year, FISH has provided school supplies for 842 students.

And more good news from the Soup Kitchen : two new teams have stepped up to help with meals on a monthly basis.

And from the Food Bank: the number of boxes distributed in January was 695, a significant decrease after 4 record breaking months, and donations slightly exceeded expenditures. Pray the trend continues!

Preparing for the Next 100 Years

The 100th anniversary of the construction of Trinity's sanctuary is approaching in 2016, and it's time to conduct a 100-year check-up on our historic building. As the stewards of Trinity, the Trustees need to know that the beams, columns and foundations are strong and solid. The results of the 100-year check-up, along with other recognized problems with the windows, roofs, stone

and mortar, will be used to develop a comprehensive maintenance and restoration plan for Trinity. The Church Council has authorized the Trustees to establish the Trinity Restoration Fund Committee to look into various options for raising the money needed to perform the maintenance and restoration. This may include writing or contracting for the writing of grants to help

Position Overview

The director will conduct and administer the Wesley Handbell Choir for the liturgical enhancement of weekend and special seasonal services throughout the program year as part of the musical staff at Trinity United Methodist Church. Additionally, the director will plan, coordinate, and present a Christmas season concert in December.

Preferred Qualifications

- Ability to read and interpret handbell musical scores (both

treble and bass clefs)

- Knowledge of conducting patterns and experience conducting handbell/chimes choirs
- Knowledge of music theory and handbell/chime notation
- Knowledge of techniques required to perform handbell/chime music
- Knowledge of handbell literature
- Knowledge or ability to select appropriate handbell/chime music
- Ability to lead volunteers of varying musical skill levels
- Ability to work collaboratively with other music staff and clergy regarding use of handbell music at worship services

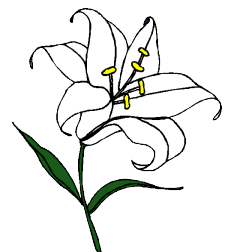
