

Pastor's Perspective

The apostles gathered around Jesus, and told him all that they had done and taught. He said to them, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves. (Mark 6:30-32 NRSV)

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Your generosity helped assure that ten kids from Trinity had the opportunity to go to church camp this summer. Your generosity also allows me to serve as a dean at camp without having to take that week that I'm gone as vacation; then I don't have to make the choice between serving God in that capacity or getting dearly needed rest and rejuvenation. Please allow me to comment on why I believe your funds were well spent.

There were 25 children who had finished 3rd, 4th or 5th grade at Sawtooth Camp Elementary 1. They got to do things they had never done before and would likely not have a chance to do in any other setting! For instance, we waded in the creek. Only 3 of the 25 had ever done that before. Nowadays, we swim in chlorinated pools where there are no worms or frogs and no mud to squish between your toes. If you have ever waded in a creek you know that it is a completely different and joy filled experience, from an antiseptic pool (which is only an O.K. substitute for an old fashioned swimming hole.)

Instead of just a few minutes on Sunday morning learning about the love of God through our savior Jesus Christ, these kids got to live and learn about that love 24-7. They had a clergy person who they could safely ask

questions of, so that their budding faith could be grounded in solid theology. Children ask deep questions and deserve thoughtful answers. At camp we form intentional communities of love, support and emotional safety in ways that would be difficult to replicate in the secular world.

The nurse was always close at hand as we stretched our minds and bodies in ways that might be too scary to try in everyday life. I am happy to report that there were no broken bones, fewer abrasions than Band-Aids to cover them, all of the slivers got removed and the camper who brought a nebulizer which never got used said, "I breathe way better up here than at home".

New friendships got forged. Our Trinity kids built stronger connections with each other and were able to bond with United Methodist children from around Idaho. Camp allows us to have the kind of fresh start in relationships that everyone deserves. It's a time practice being your best self. Cabin time in the evening and "family group" time each day offered opportunities to rehearse relationship building skills.

As dean, I was able to observe the kids in ways that their teachers don't usually have time to. When one of our campers, who had exhibited several classic signs of abuse, was not very interested in going home, I was able to contact their pastor to follow up on this camper. The pastor had wondered before, but my concern and an incident that happened shortly after the camper's return home, led to a report being made to Children's Protective Services. There is a world of difference



The church, at it's best, is an institution that promotes love, learning, safety, and healthy relationship with God and others. Camp is a place where this happens and fabulous tool for the

church to shine in people's lives! Am I exhausted after camp: yes. Do I want to go back next year: yes!

Committee Reports:

F.I.S.H. is gearing up for the school supply season; last year there were 780 orders filled. Volunteers gathered to make 400 hygiene kits that were delivered to Job Service and to the Crisis Center. Consumables such as paper products and personal hygiene are being provided to Promise Ridge, a ministry of First Presbyterian Church; fresh fruit is being provided by volunteers on an as-needed basis.

Community Food Basket and Soup Kitchen:

The Food Basket served 1,017 families in June; the Soup Kitchen provided 3,760 meals during June. The Food Basket had a float and their van in the 4th of July parade. The farm in Blackfoot that provided acreage for planting by the Food Basket is beginning to yield - 250 lbs. of fresh peas; next up, beans! Volunteers to help weed and harvest will be needed through Fall; meet at the Food Basket warehouse on Fridays at 8:30 AM. The Food Basket is anticipating a large bequest and also a gift from an anonymous donor, which will allow them to deal with wage issues and potentially purchase the warehouse.

Other business and activities:

Dr. Fritz Schmutz reported on the activities of the Interfaith Community Project. Several RCCM activities are beneficiaries of their work of gathering food, school supplies and other items. They have been engaged in this work for 8 years. The Mayor and City Council participated in their 4th of July parade entry.

Promise Ridge, the temporary family housing ministry of First Presbyterian Church, is going well. Their board meets monthly. Families have access to the Community Food Basket across the street, and the Food Basket gleaners provide baked goods. A House Blessing is being planned.

The Monday/Wednesday/Friday free lunch for kids at the picnic shelter along the Greenbelt near E Street is attracting about 30 - 35 children each day. It will continue until August 17.

St. John's Lutheran Church is hosting a monthly pot luck luncheon, the 2nd Tuesday of each month at noon. All are invited to participate. They are also working on the homeless information packets.

F.I.S.H. School Supply Program

During the school year 2016-2017, FISH has provided school supplies to 780 students in Districts 91 and 93. The retail cost of these materials at \$50 each was \$39,000 and they weighed 11,700 lb. - that's almost 6 tons! How do we do it? We do it through the generosity and hard work of members of our community. We distribute the supplies through the schools by responding to a request from a teacher, counselor or school secretary. The supplies are packed and delivered to the school where they are then given to the child in a private manner so they look just like "they came from home."

We began our program in 1993 by helping 116 students. As you can see, as the need has grown, FISH's commitment and the communi-

ty's generosity has expanded to meet it. We hope, with your help, to be able to meet that need again this year. The smiles of the children who thought they would not have supplies like the other kids, are priceless and make it all worthwhile.

Trinity Restoration - Nancy Stewart

On July 6 we met with our Architect, Richard Creason of Myers Anderson, to discuss the following:

- ⇒ The building permit is ready to be issued when we award the contract to a General Contractor. (They pay the fee to the city and it is issued to their company.)
- ⇒ The contractor walk through of the bathrooms, warming kitchen and finish upgrades will be held on August 2nd.
- ⇒ We will receive the bids from the General Contractors on August 16th.
- ⇒ The construction window is listed as September 1 to December 31 of this year.
- ⇒ An asbestos and lead survey of the areas we will impact was completed at a cost of about \$1,400. We have determined asbestos remedi-



ation will be about \$10,000. We decided to include it in the bid package Richard is sending to ~ 40 General Contractors.

We received a 1:1 matching grant from the Maeck Family Foundation of \$23,500 in July, and in June the Museum of Idaho donated \$9,000 to our project. We are very thankful for all of the generous donations we have received during our Capital Funds Campaign.

Special thanks for the support and grant from National Fund for Sacred Places, which is a partnership of the National Trust for Historic Preservation and Partners for Sacred Places.
