Theme: The Gift Has Arrived

Sermon: "Do We Welcome the Light, Or Does the Light Welcome Us?"

Scripture: John 1:1-14

Before time itself was measured, the Voice was speaking. The Voice was and is God. This celestial Word remained ever present with the Creator; His speech shaped the entire cosmos. Immersed in the practice of creating, all things that exist were birthed in Him. His breath filled all things with a living, breathing light, a light that thrives in the depths of darkness, blazes through murky bottoms. It cannot and will not be quenched. A man named John, who was sent by God, was the first to clearly articulate the source of this Light. This baptizer put in plain words the elusive mystery of the Divine Light so all might believe through him. Some wondered whether he might be the Light, but John was not the Light. He merely pointed to the Light. The true Light, who shines upon the heart of everyone, was coming into the cosmos. He entered our world, a world He made; yet the world did not recognize Him. Even though He came to His own people, they refused to listen and receive Him. But for all who did receive and trust in Him, He gave them the right to be reborn as children of God; He bestowed this birthright not by human power or initiative but by God's will. The Voice took on flesh and became human and chose to live alongside us. We have seen Him, enveloped in undeniable splendor — the one true Son of God – evidenced in the perfect balance of grace and truth.

Last Week's Sermon 12/18



All through Advent I have been preaching about waiting, so finally today, let's look at whether we are there yet! Perhaps if we revisit some of the scriptures that lead up to today's part of the story there will be clues. For those of you who have participated in the Advent book study, it has been clear that both the writers of Luke and Matthew have agendas in mind. Each of those books begin with a genealogy of Jesus. Luke, who wants us to envision Jesus as the new Adam, traces Christ's lineage through all of the males back to Adam and then God. Matthew however, who wants us to see Christ as the new Moses offers up a lineage only goes back to Abraham and curiously includes four women whom society would scrutinize harshly, but are beloved and honored by God.

Perhaps the first clue is that being beloved and honored by God is not dependent on your genealogy.



Our next scripture stop is from the gospel of Luke when the angel Gabriel announces to Zechariah that he and Elizabeth would become parents even though they were well past child bearing age.

When Zechariah does not believe that God can accomplish this, Gabriel takes away Zechariah's ability to speak until after the child is born, and Zechariah follows Gabriel's instructions to name the baby boy John.

Clue number two, angels really are in direct contact with God, so you should believe what they tell you.



We jump over to the gospel of Matthew for our next scripture clue.

This one involves Gabriel also, as the angel visits Mary, the mother of Jesus.

When Gabriel tells Mary that she will become pregnant, she believes the messenger from God, even though she is perplexed about just how this can happen since she and Joseph are not yet having sex.

Mary's response, after Gabriel's explanation that she has been chosen to carry the son of God, is one of acceptance.

Clue number three, with God, all things are possible.



Don't get whiplash, but the next scripture signal is from the gospel of Luke. It's that beautiful scene when Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth who is more than six months along in her pregnancy. At the mere sound of Mary's greeting, the baby, who we will come to know as John the Baptist, leaps for joy in Elizabeth's womb.

In that moment, Mary breaks forth in song. But not just any song, one that proclaims that God is doing a new thing which will topple the current power

structures and bring about egalitarianism in the world.

Clue number four is that God has a clear purpose for coming to the world in the flesh!




Which brings us to today's lesson from the gospel of Matthew.

Joseph breaks with societal norms, and instead of having Mary condemned to death, either quickly by stoning, or slowly because she would have no way to provide for herself and the child, he chooses to dismiss her quietly.

Joseph then chooses to listen to God, although the advice seems outlandish, even unbelievable! Joseph does what I believe God is asking each of us to do: to be cocreators of the future.

The final clue:
We are to be co-creators
of the future.



A future such as Mary pronounces in the Magnificat:

My soul proclaims Your greatness, O God. My spirit rejoices in You who make me whole. For You have looked with favor upon me despite my insignificance. Amazingly, from now on, all generations will call me blessed.

You, O God, have done great things for me; And holy is Your name.

My soul proclaims Your greatness.

You extend mercy and compassion from age to age.

To all those who hold You in awe.

You have shown Your sacred strength, dispersing the arrogant of mind and heart, casting rulers from their thrones and lifting up the lowly; filling the hungry with

good things and sending the rich away empty.

My soul proclaims Your greatness.

You have come to the aid of Your servant Israel mindful of Your mercy and the promise You made to our ancestors, to Abraham and Sarah and their descendants forever."

My soul proclaims Your greatness. Yes, the clues all point to this! This is what we have been waiting for, a savior who brings about the promise of peace on earth. My friends, we are *oh* so *close*!
