Welcoming Statement for Trinity United Methodist Church

As was mentioned in last month's newsletter, on January 1st Trinity UMC will start the process of developing a Welcoming Statement. A Welcoming Statement is the church equivalent of the non-discrimination statement all employers must have. You have likely seen it: *"we do not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion (creed), gender, ..."* Employers have it easy because we have passed laws on how they must behave. Congregations on the other hand, must look into their hearts, consider their purposes in the community, and then come up with Welcoming Statements that represent how they all really feel.

At Trinity we want to approach this task with as much education and discernment as possible. In order to do that we have proposed a 6-step process that will take place over several months.

1. Starting January 1st, ten welcoming statements from other churches will be on display in the parlor and the back of the sanctuary. These will be available throughout Epiphany so that all the members of the congregation can read and compare them to get familiar with the concept.

2. Beginning in January, Rev. Ruth will teach a 6 part series called "For the Bible Tells Me So."
3. During the 6 weeks of Lent, which begins March 1st, a task force composed of a cross-section of the congregation will craft a Welcoming Statement.
4. In April Trinity UMC will host the "Called to Love" workshop to explore some of the issues involved when there is not acceptance.
5. The new Welcoming Statement will be made available to the congregation in the newsletter and on posters in parlor for several weeks for discussion.
6. In May, at the conclusion of the process, the congregation will have an opportunity to vote to accept the new Welcoming Statement.

Hopefully this process will assure that Trinity UMC is known in the community as the loving congregation I know you to be.

Building Preservation - Board of Trustees

The National Fund for Sacred Places (NFSP) has awarded Trinity a spot in their matching grant process. Their grant process includes support and training to develop the plan, and training for a successful capital funds campaign.

Activities through February include:

- ⇒ Development of a more detailed building assessment to allow donors to see our vision.
- ⇒ Entering into an agreement with Myers-Anderson, an architectural firm, to complete the assessment.

⇒ Attending training for a Capital Funds Campaign 101 course in late January (Rev. Ruth, Nancy Stewart, and Mike Bean who will spearhead the Capital Campaign).

The exciting portion of this phase is that the NFSP includes a planning grant of \$5,000.00 which will allow us to start right away in these activities.

Trinity will be 100 years old in 2017. The Trinity restoration is a prayerful and purposeful effort to restore the masonry, roof, and bathrooms to 21st century needs. Our founders believed in our ability to care for the beautiful building they completed 100 years ago.

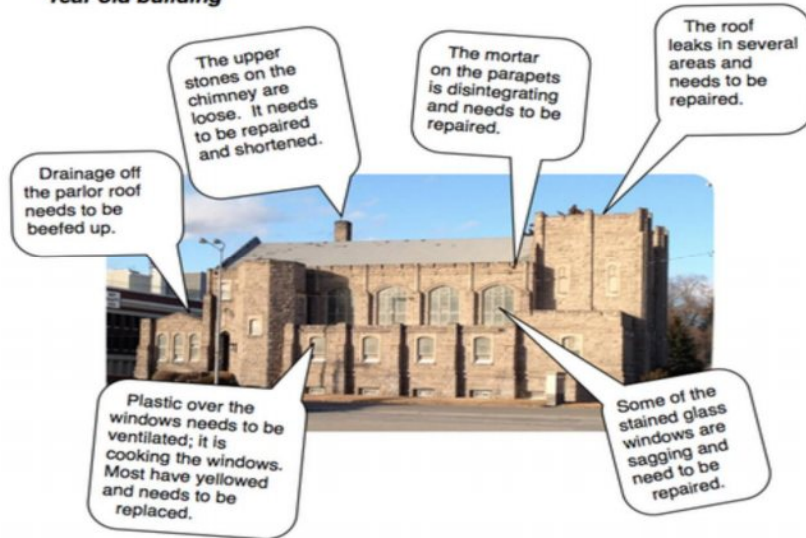
We are eager to follow in our founder's footsteps with the Lord as our guide.

RCCM Committee Reports:

- FISH provided school supplies for 829 students during the current school year. Generous community support enabled FISH to help many adults and children with school supplies, hygiene kits, and newborn and infant needs.
- Community Food Basket served 775 households during October. This season there are 14 food drives occurring in the community.
- Little Church in the Pines is planning its annual Christmas Eve service.

- Soup Kitchen served 4234 meals to 3350 individuals during October.
- The Alternate Giving Fair was held November 12 and 13 at EITC. Thirty non-profit organizations participated and raised over \$14,000.

Planning for the Future of the Community Food Basket:




As the Community Food Basket has grown and become supported by an increasing number of community organizations and businesses, the Regional

Council of Christian Ministry has begun the process of 'spinning off' the organization.

During the coming months, the RCCM, through its Executive Board, will develop a schedule for transitioning the Food Basket to a new faith-based, non-profit corporation with its own board of directors.

An interim director will be hired to serve until the transfer is complete, including the recognition of the Community Food Basket as an independent 501(c)(3) organization.
