

Otherwise, after he has laid the foundation and cannot finish it, all the onlookers will begin to make fun of him, saying, 'This man started to build and wasn't able to finish.'

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,
In last month's Trinity Times I mentioned a figure that represented the church budget for 2017: \$209,304. Copies of the budget are available in the office.

This month, let me show you how your generosity will be at work through the actions of Trinity United Methodist Church this year. The pie chart on the following page spreads our expenses across five different ministry areas. That way it's easier to visualize what we DO with the money rather than just focusing on how much particular things cost. For instance, the total of all building costs add up to over \$30,000, which seems like a lot, but when you spread that cost over all of the areas that the congregation and the community benefit from, you can see what a good deal we get. We are not just pouring our money into a




building that needs to be fixed, but making a difference in Idaho Falls. The term for this kind of description is called forming a “narrative budget”.




Building Preservation - Board of Trustees

Your trustees are working to implement the grant from that The National Fund for Sacred Places (NFSP) has awarded Trinity. Their grant process includes support and training to develop the plan, and training for a successful capital funds campaign.

Accomplishments in December:

- ⇒ The free-will offering from The Snake River Radio Player's presentation of Miracle on 34th Street totaled \$1,047 and was applied to our matching grant.
- ⇒ An agreement has been signed with Myers-Anderson, an architectural firm, to complete the detailed condition assessment of our building which will allow donors to see our vision and be assured

that there is a clear path of priorities.

Activities for January will include:

- ⇒ Submission of the form for the \$5,000 Planning Grant from National Fund for Sacred Places. This will help pay for the assessment.
- ⇒ Attending a training in Fort Worth, TX, about strategies for fundraising will be will be Rev. Ruth, Nancy Stewart, and Mike Bean who will spearhead the Capital Campaign.

Trinity will be 100 years old in 2017. The Trinity restoration is a prayerful and purposeful effort to restore the masonry, roof, and bathrooms to 21st century needs. Our founders believed in our ability to care for the beautiful building they completed 100 years ago. We are eager to follow in our founder's footsteps with the Lord as our guide.

Regional Council for Christian Ministry

The Regional Council for Christian Ministry held its final meeting of the year on December 13th.

Committee reports:

F.I.S.H. has delivered school supplies to 873 students this year; 33 client families were served in November.

Community Food Basket served 4203 people in November (1,040 households – 2,147 adults, 1776 children, 280 seniors). A \$1,500 grant was received from the INL, and several food drives are on-going. The organization is finalizing the move to a new warehouse.

Little Church in the Pines will have a Christmas Eve service at 7 PM, December 24th.

Other Business:

Thanksgiving Eve Service received an offering of \$280 which will be given to the Hospice youth grief support group.

Community Food Basket The Community Food Basket and RCCM have prepared a letter explaining the plans for transitioning to an independent non-profit organization. It will be distributed to volunteers, board members and member churches. Bud Langerak has been hired to serve as interim director during the transition.

2017 Lenten series: member churches are asked to provide speakers or serve as host churches during the Lenten series, March 10 through April 7th.

Community News:

Soup Kitchen served 3,187 adults and 235 children during November. The year-to-date total is 33,845 adults and 2,832 children served.

Race to Feed the Hungry generated \$5,600 for the Community Food Basket.

Homeless Stand Down, an event to provide information about the number of homeless in our community, will be on January 28th. A hot breakfast, warm clothing and sleeping bags, some medical services, and a variety of 'take-away' foods will be provided. In addition, services are provided to homeless veterans at the event.

"For the Bible Tells Me So" Series

Over the span of 5 weeks, beginning January 15th, at 4 pm, we will delve into why so many people use the Bible to support attitudes of homophobia. "For the Bible Tells Me So" is a movie that focuses on how conservative Christians' interpretation of the Bible is commonly used as a way to deny homosexuals equal rights.

Following five families with an openly gay son or daughter, director Daniel G. Karslake offers a firsthand look at how those in the Christian community with an "out" child are affected by the homophobic fervor.

Through the experiences of five very normal, very Christian, very American families -- including those of former

House Majority Leader Richard Gephardt and Episcopal Bishop Gene Robinson -- we discover how insightful people of faith handle the realization of having a gay child. Informed by such respected voices as Bishop Desmond Tutu, Harvard's Peter Gomes, Orthodox Rabbi Steve Greenberg and Reverend Jimmy Creech, "For the Bible Tells Me So" offers healing, clarity and understanding to anyone caught in the crosshairs of scripture and sexual identity.

Reverend Ruth will help us examine, with scholarly rigor, the 8 scriptures (and yes, that's how many there are in the whole Bible) that are commonly thought to refer to homosexuality.

Hello, I'm Rob Erikson, a member of Trinity for a number of years. I am looking for volunteers from church to cook and serve dinner one night a week at City of Refuge, no cleanup involved.

The Idaho Falls Rescue Mission serves an evening meal at 6:00 pm every night to hungry residents and needy folks from the area. We plan for about 80 servings. Many guests have poor teeth and cannot eat food items like raw vegetables that are difficult to chew. Desert is not essential. Spaghetti, meat-

loaf, chili, well cooked pot roast, sandwiches, tuna casserole, potatoes and toppings, baked fish, baked chicken, and stews are some of the regular dishes. Food can be prepared and brought to the shelter, or prepared in the shelter kitchen. Volunteers are encouraged to serve the meal and eat with the residents. Cleanup is part of the C.O.R. residents routine chores.
