Building Beloved Community

The Restoration Steering Team has invited a small group of students who are studying Public Relations for Finance Campaigns at BYU-I to help us get the word out about restoring Trinity's beautiful building.

"Building Beloved Community" will be the name and catchphrase of the capital funds campaign for Trinity Restoration with Trinity UMC being referred to as a jewel of Idaho Falls.

On July 1st there will be a Service Day at the church when the public - and you - will be invited to participate in various work or service projects such as: painting in the parlor, assembling UMCOR kits or painting the outside handrail. As people are doing these projects we will ask them to #jewelofidahofalls on social media. More to come on this special event.

Building Preservation - Board of Trustees

Myers-Anderson architectural firm completed the Facilities Assessment for our church. This document will be used to communicate our monetary needs with the public and our congregation. The document notes our need for a new sanctuary roof, masonry work and bathroom upgrades both upstairs and downstairs. We also have a rough cost estimate for other needs throughout our building as part of our 10-year plan for TUMC.

On April 27. we completed 29 interviews as part of the Feasibility Study for a capital funds campaign for our church. This was lead by Partners for Sacred Places. Thank you to everyone who participated. We are waiting for

their report, expected by June 1, and will share the results with you on the suggested size of our Capital Funds campaign.

Mike Croson has taken the lead on this year's restoration work. Idaho

Abatement has completed the first phase to remove the bituminous paper at a cost of \$4,489.82. This work will be covered in half using the matching

Idaho Heritage Grant of \$8,750 that Lynn Seymour and Terri Robinson obtained in 2015.

On May 16th Highlander Masonry started securing



the capstones around the exterior of our masonry. Mike Croson and Barry O'Brien are overseeing this work.

We have communicated with Idaho Heritage that we have started the work scope for their matching funds grant and have the forms and data necessary to complete their paperwork.

Myers Anderson, our architect, is overseeing this years work and will also help us to identify and hire someone to patch the roof leaks in the parlor and the Education Wing Stairwell this year. —Nancy Stewart


Chukars Baseball Barbeaue!

Regional Council for Christian Ministry

F.I.S.H. - General assistance: There were two areas of particular need during April: visits to the Community Family Clinic and associated prescriptions, and fuel vouchers. We were reminded that it is not advisable to give money to people requesting assistance at street corners; instead, there are small flyers (available to you at the church office) that list many locations in town where free meals are available.

Services for Students: in July, school supply sales will begin; if you would like to help with purchases, general school supply lists, by school and grade level, are available at many of the stores. Jo Daniels, in the RCCM office, also has a general supply list that she can email to you. During the 2016 - 2017 school year, supplies were given to 913 students. Also, F.I.S.H. works with District 93 to provide backpacks with a weekend's worth of 'good calories' for students identified by the schools. F.I.S.H. is looking for volunyear to fill the backpacks or deliver to the schools. Call Bev Kemp if you are able to help (she's listed in the church directory).

Community Food Basket - During April, 801 families (3,137 individuals) were helped. The first four months of the year has seen a very slight decrease in numbers. Dollar contributions are up over \$2,000 for the first four months of the year compared to the same period in 2016 and over \$61,000 (!) over the same period in 2015. The Food Basket has relocated its warehouse to 1895 N.

Boulevard. Food drives continue throughout the community; upcoming drives include LDS Stake food drives every month except October, a concert in Ammon, and the VW Enthusiasts car show in August. \$3,200 was realized during the Idaho Gives campaign in early May. The RCCM Board approved hiring a part-time maintenance person who will work at the Food Basket warehouse and the distribution building; costs will be paid by the Food Basket.

Community News:

Soup Kitchen: During April, 4542 meals were served, an average of 151 per day. The Idaho Gives campaign netted \$6,000 for the Soup Kitchen and students at Skyline H.S. donated \$7,000. The Soup Kitchen would like to have a team commit to cooking/ serving on the 2nd Saturday of each month.

Homeless Stand Down will be held on teers on Wednesdays during the school November 4th this year, a change from the traditional late January date. F.I.S.H. is responsible for white tube socks and 'portable protein' - individual packaged servings of tuna, chicken, soft energy bars, etc., and would appreciate donations (put an item or two in your cart each time you shop....you'll hardly notice the difference in your bill, and you'll be surprised at how quickly your donation grows!)



Parlor Organ:

Lynn Seymour is working hard to find a home for our Par-

lor organ (which is hard to even give away). A donated piano will replace the organ.
