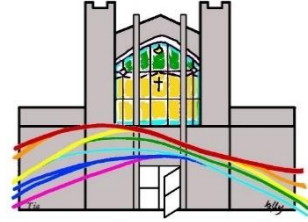

### Idaho Falls United Methodists: Better Together



#### Update from Rev. Elizabeth

We continue to have a strong showing of people at the Third Sunday Workshops. This

is a good sign that we are holding momentum in our work together. Through the Third Sunday Workshops, led by the Discernment Team, we have essentially completed the steps in Chapter 1 of the Cooperative Parishes book:

#### Chapter 1 Checklist

- ✓ Establish your why
- ✓ Partner with District Superintendent
- ✓ Create Prayer Team
- ✓ Create Discernment Team
- ✓ Conduct Ministry Evaluations
- ✓ Conduct Focus Group Conversations
- ✓ Conduct SWOT Analysis of Individual Churches
- ✓ Communicate Discernment Regarding the Team's Analysis and Recommendation

Chapter 2 calls for even more intensive work. It involves gathering data and creating a venn diagram of the Leadership's Passions, Community Needs, and Congregation's Gifts (p. 59). The overlap between these three projects is where a vision to reach unchurched people will emerge.

The current project is to identify the passions and gifts of the church leaders through Rick Warren's S.H.A.P.E spiritual gifts assessment. It is rather long, and somewhat daunting, but it will prove to be very useful in many ways. It took me about 2 hours to complete. Most of the Discernment Team has completed the process and the two Church Councils will be asked to participate as well.

Now, I invite you into this process. Would you participate in the SHAPE spiritual gifts assessment? I am attaching it to this email. Please complete the assessment and send the page that starts with "My Shape Profile", the 2nd to last page, to Don Rohde in hard copy or email to donrohde@aol.com. Don will compile the results.

The results we have already received have brought great insight into how we can utilize each person's gifts to complement one another. I hope you will participate so that you can grow in your discipleship as a follower of Jesus Christ.

## Joint Worship Committee

As part of the insight from the Focus Groups wanting effective ministry with less redundancies, a Joint Worship Committee has been formed. The Worship Team consists of Tommy Lew, Don Rohde, Ryan Atwood, Ann Shively, Nancy Copp, Melinda Ginosar, Angela Shanor, The Heart Events, and Rev. Elizabeth.

We meet every Thursday at 10:30am, alternating each month between Trinity and St. Paul's. The committee is working on a new look for the bulletin that will be the same bulletin for both churches. The announcement slides will also be the same, highlighting the special events and ministries in both churches. The Heart Events is working to ensure quality sound and Facebook presence in both churches. The Joint Worship Committee is working diligently to grow and enhance the worship experience, to reach out, receive, nurture and send out disciples of Christ for the transformation of the world.

## Ministry Conference

The Ministry Conference with St. Paul's UMC and Trinity UMC is confirmed for Friday, Oct. 11 at 9 a.m. The meeting will be held at the St. Paul's church.

The Ministry Conference is an informal gathering to which the entire congregation is invited. Church Leaders should plan to attend.

As a preparation, church leaders should review the 'OR-ID Church M.I.L.E Assessment,' completed last fall. Church leaders can access it when they login to the People Portal on the conference website: <https://www.umoi.org/log-in>. SPRC members will meet with DS Karen for a short check-in after the ministry conference.

## Homeless Services

In July there were 198 homeless services supplied in the 18 days we were open. This is up from June's count of 163 in 16 days. This represented services to 51 unique people (up from 48).

The services provided included 183 showers (up from 142), 44 loads of laundry (up from 33), and 17 requests for supplies (up from 8). The clients ranged in age from 5 to 73 with an average age of 47.

Time in the church varied from 1 min. to 291 minutes with an average of 43 minutes. Most were returning clients, with 5 new clients. 74% have cellphones and 74% have valid ID.

## RCCM Update

Things continue to happen at the Community Food Basket with continued need. There were 1,257 families served in June and 1,536 families in July. The food rescue van was in the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade, CFB was selected to be the recipient of B.A. Wackerli's Subaru Share the Love Event, and the North Highway Café raffled Luke Bryan Tickets and raised \$4,100.

Casino Royale Night will be held Saturday, September 14<sup>th</sup> from 5-9 at the Holiday Inn & Suites. Join in the fun and games, with dinner, drinks, cash bar, music, silent and live auctions. Individual tickets are \$100 and sponsorships are available. Watersprings is doing an auction to benefit CFB on August 24<sup>th</sup>.

Fish is gearing up for school supplies- immediate needs are 3x5 index card and 24 count Crayola Crayons. Checks are also

accepted as purchases are made for bulk pricing. Mail check to FISH PO Box 2236 Idaho Falls, 83403 and mark for school supplies

A fund raiser will be held for Fish on Sept. 7<sup>th</sup>, from 4-8 at 169 6<sup>th</sup> Street, it is drop in and there will be a bar-b-que. Bring your own chair.



## 2024 Ministry Conference

This annual event is open to the entire congregation, with church leaders especially encouraged to attend. Key topics include **Ministry that Matter, Itinerary, Lay Ministry, and Eliminating Racism.**



## Upcoming Changes

Beginning September 8<sup>th</sup>, there will be one bulletin for both churches' worship services, and The Heart Events will produce the slides for both churches. The bulletin will be color-coded to help those at each church follow along. Most of the service is the same at both churches and the unique feel of each church will continue. St. Paul's will continue to have the Chancel Choir and Praise Team, while Trinity has an organist, pianist, and a song leader. We will continue to have Kid's Time, and celebrate Holy Communion each Sunday. Lay readers will continue to participate. At Trinity, we are going to ask people to sign-up at least a week ahead of time.

A couple of changes will be made to the worship services. At Trinity, "Choosing Your Favorite Hymn" will be selected from a running list of hymns submitted by attendees instead of selected during worship. This will allow slides to be made for online participants. If you have a favorite hymn, you would like added to the list for Trinity, please fill out the attendance form with your favorite hymns and place it in the offering plate.

At St. Paul's we will have an opportunity to "Share Joys and Concerns" prior to the Pastoral Prayer. This will help us see how God is moving in our midst as we pray for one another. Please be brief as you share!

"Thanks God" has been the closing song at St. Paul's for many years it is a wonderful celebration to close the service with the special song written by Jerry Shively. Trinity will begin to use "Thanks God" as the closing song as well.

This process is a work in progress. As we receive feedback, the Joint Worship Committee will consider new ideas to enhance our worship, that it may be pleasing to God. 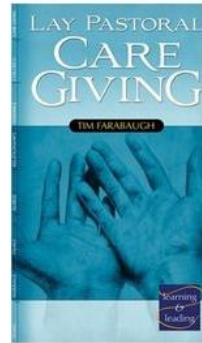
Lay Servant Ministries is one of the significant lay leadership development programs available within the United Methodist connection.

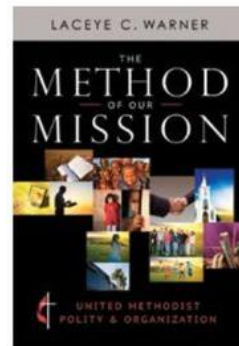

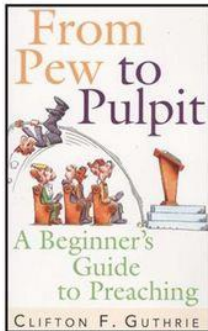

### Important Details to Know Before You Go:

If you will be arriving after dark, please let the camp know so that someone can be available to welcome you and help you get situated in your assigned cabin. 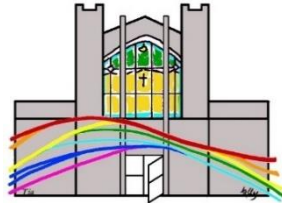

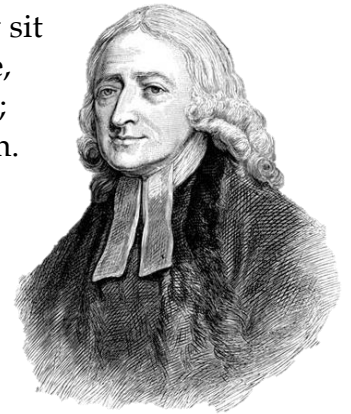
