Report of Lay Members Jim and Cindy Mason of St. Paul's to the Oregon-Idaho Conference held June 20-23, 2024 at Tigard, OR

This was the first time we had attended an Annual Conference and were amazed at the packed agenda and opportunities for fellowship. Our Bishop Cedrick Bridgeforth presided over the four day meeting. Our theme was Being Well. We had videos presented that reflected what churches were doing to implement mental health, spiritual health, ecological health, physical health, plus conference camp & retreat ministries, and theological seminaries.

We were briefed on the happenings at General Conference regarding the major changes coming regarding the removal of harmful language regarding LBGTQIA people as well as the pending legislation regarding regionalization around the world. We learned that there are approximately 350 church buildings in the Greater NW Area with 40% of those churches with average attendance per Sunday of less than 25people. This creates issues in assigning full Elders to each church. The Area classifies pastors as: Elders, provisional members, associates, licensed local pastors, certified lay ministers, and lay assigned persons. To cover the pastoral needs of the congregations, it is necessary for the Bishop and his staff to be creative in assigning pastors to existing churches. There have been Elders assigned to two or more church buildings in a district. part-time pastors and other classifications of pastors that arenot yet Elder. Some congregations are being led by LayLeaders or Deacons or Deaconesses.

We were updated by speakers and videos regarding the many things the UMCdoes in our district. conference and the area covered by our Bishop. We covered issues working through the MILE focal points and the many entities that we support in our area. OR-ID AC 2024 on Vimeo.

Conference Reports (cont.)

In presentations and workshops, we discussed Ministry that Matters where we discussed working together across the Area.

By consolidating functions, as the Bishop recently did with the District Superintendents, we can focus our ministries in the local church communities with An emphasis on housing, climate, hunger and health. Bysetting our ministry across the Area, the Council on Finance & Administration will bebetter able to craft a budget for 2025. Bishop Cedrick has asked each of the three conferences in GNW area to wait to develop and pass a budget for each conference until after a period of intentional reflection and conversation about our values, priorities and level of commitment to collaboration across the Greater NW area.

These discussions will beheld by zoom through the end of September. A special session will be called to approve the 2025 budgets. Setting Ministry Priorities: Conversations about Mission & Budget across

the Greater Northwest Area - Greater Northwest Area I News (greaternw.org).

Several video and panel discussions addressed the work of the Equity Cohort to address our work on eliminating racism. We are making progress.

The plenary (legislative sessions) was conducted by Bishop Cedrick and were orderly and professionally organized by the parliamentarian. The 0-1Conference voted on the following Action Requests and Standing Resolutions as determined by the Legislative Assembly:

- SRI Protecting the Right to Peacefully Address Injustice Through Boycotts, Divestment, and Sanctions
- SR2 Supporting Middle East Peace Efforts
- SR3 Confronting Racism and White Supremacy
- SR4 Climate Stewardship includes Reducing Greenhouse Gases
- The Bishop read an apology drafted at the General Conference from the Church to all our communities for our complicity in sexual misconduct.
- Special worship services were held for Commissioning and Ordination with Reading of Appointments and the Memorial Service.
- We were amazed at the work being done in the Oregon-Idaho Conference with our apportionments. The conference was uplifting and inspiring!

Third Sunday Workshop

The next gathering to discuss the Cooperative Parish model for the Idaho Falls United Methodists: Better Together will be Sunday August 18 at 4pm at Trinity UMC. Last month we had a ministry evaluation of the 2 churches. We also conducted SWOT (Strength, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) analysis of the individual churches and the Cooperative Parish. Homeless Services

In July there were 198 homeless services supplied in the 18 days we were open. This is up from June's count of 163 in 16 days. This represented services to 51 unique people (up from 48). The services provided included 183 showers (up from 142), 44 loads of laundry (up from 33), and 17 requests for supplies (up from 8). The clients ranged in age from 5 to 73 with an average age of 47. Time in the church varied from 1 min. to 291 minutes with an average of 43 minutes. Most were returning clients, with 5 new clients. 74% have cellphones and 74% have valid ID. Most were returning clients, with 4 new clients. 68% have cellphones and 64% have valid ID.




