

Homeless Services

In June there were 163 homeless services supplied in the 16 days we were open. This is fewer than May's count of 195 in 18 days. This represented services to 48 unique people (down from 63). The services provided included 142 showers (down from 155), 33 loads of laundry (down from 44), and 8 requests for supplies (Down from 9). The clients ranged in age from 18 to 78 with an average age of 51. Time in the church varied from 1 min. to 190 minutes with an average of 39 minutes. Most were returning clients, with 4 new clients. 68% have cellphones and 64% have valid ID.

Thanks to everyone who donated during our Sunday brunch this past Sunday, your generosity is instrumental in helping us to serve those most in need.


