Last Week's Sermon 6/18

Theme for the day: God's Plans Sermon: "When in Doubt, Laugh" Focus Scripture: (Genesis 18:1-15, 21:1-7)

Siri, tell me a joke –

You have likely heard the expression "If I don't laugh, I will cry." These past few weeks of dealing with car insurance after the wreck, and simultaneously preparing to move, has left me on the verge of, or in, tears many times. When something is difficult beyond imagination, we say that it is laughable. That is the situation Sarah found herself in when she overheard God tell her husband, Abraham, that she would give birth to a baby by this time next year. Indeed, it was outrageous!



We learn in the previous chapter, Genesis 17, that when Sarai and Abram were asked to enter into covenant relationship with God and start a new nation, the couple is 90 and 99. No wonder it was an endeavor worthy of God renaming them Sarah and Abraham. When the Apostle Paul writes about Abraham in Romans 4, he tells us that "Abraham was already as good as dead because he was about a 100 years old. Abraham and Sarah are not just old, they are ancient... and probably tired... They have worked so long, and so

hard, and so faithfully for God! The situation was laughable.

The situation that the Bishop and Cabinet have asked Trinity and St. Paul's to enter into may seem laughable as well. They are asking us to embark on a season of re-thinking, retraining, and re-growth. Figuratively, we will, like Abraham and Sarah, be going places we have never gone before. It's enough to make the bravest heart question. And so, when in doubt; laugh. Siri, tell me a joke.



It may have seemed laughable, but in God's faithfulness to Sarah and Abraham, new life emerged, and their family came to number the stars in the night sky.



I know that God will be faithful to Trinity as well. The way that this congregation thrives may not look like it did in the past, but never-the-less, a bright future for Trinity will begin to take shape in the next few months. Amen.


Trinity has had a long tradition of assisting with scholarships. Please give what you can to the fund so these youths can have a life-changing experience. We will continue to accept donations through the summer.

Homeless Services

In May there were 113 homeless services supplied in the 19 days we were open. This represented services to 41 unique persons. The clients ranged in age from 18 to 73 with an average age of 41.6. The services provided included 97 showers, 17 loads of laundry, and 7 requests for supplies. The supplies included hygiene kits, socks, underwear, gas and photocopying. 16 visitors were new clients for us. 53% have cellphones and 90% had valid ID.

provide the registration fee and whatever additional money they can pay. Discounts and scholarships are available and provided by local churches or the conference. Our goal is to see that all students that wish to go to camp can participate. We urge each congregation to donate to a camp fund and fundraise to cover costs.
