

UWF News



Summer is underway and hopefully you are planning to join us at Mission U in July. Details will follow in future weeks. For now, I'd like to share an article from the current Response magazine (May/June 2024) written by Kim Rice Smith. Its about why younger women are not joining United Women In Faith and also a church. She writes the following:

"Can you think of anything more elusive in many UWF units than women under the age of 39?... We spend an inordinate amount of time lamenting where they have all gone."

Smith continues the article describing two women, Alisha Dahart 35 and Jamie Leach 36. "Leach says, 'I think there is such a stigma about church... People that haven't attended recently think their absolute worst church memories and associate all experiences with that. A lot of the time that includes shaming someone for who they are and life choices they have made.'

Dahart added, 'I think some women have an idea in their head as to what church and organized worship should be, and sometimes the reality is different from the idea. We are just people: human, messy, full of feelings that are both beautiful and ugly. We serve God who knows this because he created us. He wants us to come to him as we are. He accepts us, and in love we accept each other. At church we can do that and be messy together.'... When asked about advice for congregations looking to grow their 39 and

under numbers, both women gave incredibly profound reflections. 'Don't give up on your outreach. Continue to seek the younger generations out because everyone needs God. They can find him through us,' Dahart stated. Leach added, 'Love everyone where they are and encourage the younger ones to get involved. I have seen where older members want to control things and aren't receptive to new ideas. We have so much friendship, love and fellowship to share!'

Takeaways from both women are acceptance, love and allowing younger members to share their passion and gifts of leadership rolls......Change is hard. Especially when we have been doing things the same way for a long time. Change is also exciting and empowering for women of all ages. Invite, accept, encourage, support and love. It sounds like a perfect formula to love as Jesus loves."



St. Paul's will be hosting Vacation Bible School in July.


VBS is July 15-18, 9:00am - Noon.

The TUMC Endowment Committee is kicking off its scholarship process for the 2024/2025 academic year.

Two scholarships are available:

- 1. The Hazel Skelton General Scholarship: one scholarship, up to \$1,000
- 2. Chesbro Music Scholarship: one scholarship, up to \$1,000, for those pursuing a college major or minor in music.

The applicants should be active member/participant of Trinity United Methodist Church or St Paul's United Methodist Church.

Applicants will be considered for all available scholarships, with selections made based on individual scholarship criteria. Therefore, each applicant only needs to submit one application package. 

Homeless Services

In April there were 154 homeless services supplied in the 17 days we were open. This represented services to 44 unique people. The services provided included 137 showers, 36 loads of laundry, and 10 requests for supplies. Supplies included socks, underwear, sleeping bags, and gallon bottles of water. The clients ranged in age from 19 to 73 with an average age of 48. Time in the church varied from 1 min. to 188 minutes with an average of 41 minutes. Most were returning clients, with 9 new clients. 62% have cellphones and 69% have valid ID.

- 2. Volunteering-I took the liberty of volunteering St. Paul's and Trinity for a couple jobs:
- a. Landscaping the yard-This will probably require $\sim \frac{1}{2}$ day. (Date TBD- probably 3rd week of May)
- b. Final house cleanup-Depending on the number of volunteers, this should also be a half-day. (Date TBD- probably mid-June)
