Sleeping Bags for the Homeless

For the fourth year in a row Trinity will have +5 degree sleeping bags available for the homeless of Idaho Falls. This mission started back in 2020 as part of the Trinity Homeless Day Shelter mission and continues as part of the Trinity Homeless Services Mission run by Pastor Ryan who is the director of the program. We are partnering with the Idaho Falls Humanitarian Center to provide woven sleeping mats to go under the sleeping bags. The mats provide insulation and some water resistance. We are starting with 32 sleeping bags purchased at a discount from Big 5 Sporting Goods with Compassionate Care fund money.

In winter of 2021–22 there was only one day below zero in Idaho Falls. In the 2022-23 winter there were 24 days below zero with one night at -30 degrees. The hope is that the 5 degree sleeping bags will cover most of the nights this winter. Sleeping bags will be available mid-October when the temperature starts to drop.

The Alzheimer's walk will be held on Saturday, September 23th. The Trinity team "Memory Methodists" is participating in the 2023 walk. Our goal is to raise \$1,000 to fight Alzheimer's.

Homeless Services

In August there were 179 homeless services supplied in the 19 days we were open. This represented services to 66 unique persons. The services provided included 147 showers, 48 loads of laundry, and 12 requests for supplies. The supplies included emergency food, hygiene kits(4), socks(2), underwear, gas(1), mail(2), driver's license replacement(1) and WIFI to study for a class(8). The clients ranged in age from 17 to 75 with an average age of 45.7. Time in the church varied from 2 min to 306 minutes with an average of 63 minutes. 20 visitors were new clients for us. 76% have cellphones and 96% had valid ID.

Habitat House Progress



The Habitat house is progressing. The exterior walls that were made at St Paul's are in place and most have the chipboard exterior sheath attach. The interior walls are stacked inside waiting to be stood up and secured to the exterior walls. Soon we will see the roof trusses in place.



ISU Wesley House is back!

This week the Wesley House at Idaho State University reopened, it had been dormant for 3 years due to COVID concerns. This is ministry supported by Pocatello First United Methodist church with occasional assistance

from other area churches. It provides a safe place for students at ISU to meet, study and have weekly group dinners. Pre-COVID Trinity took turns cooking the Tuesday night meal for the students.

Tanner and Emma Morton are the new Co-Coordinators of the Wesley House Ministry in Pocatello. They are living in the Wesley House and are excited to start welcoming students to a "home away from home" as they endeavor on their college adventures.

Their family includes our rambunctious 3-year-old, Kennedy, and two happy-go-lucky dogs, Cooper, and Willow.

Tanner was born and raised in Pocatello and is an ISU Alumnus, having just finished his MA in Political Science.


Emma is a relative newcomer to Pocatello and works at a nonprofit in Pocatello, focusing on community-driven economic development.

Both have spent a number of years volunteering and working at Methodist Camps in Idaho and Oregon, and Tanner worked with the Oregon-Idaho United Methodist Church Conference before moving back to Pocatello.

They are so excited to get to know everyone as we work together to shape and reinvigorate this ministry!



Homeless Services



Homeless services have grown to 230% since spring. Showers went from 64 per month to 147 in August. The maximum capacity for showers under perfect conditions would be about 250 per month. That means we are at about 60% of capacity in the shower department.

Laundry went from 17 loads per month to 48 in August. The maximum capacity for laundry is about 128 loads per month. We are at about 40% capacity in the laundry area. That does not include washing towels for the showers that happens after hours.

The increase in the demand for laundry has led Ryan, who directs the program, to change the process from self-service which lead to people hanging around the church basement to full-service that allows our staff to get maximum use of the machines.

Ryan also helps the homeless get replacements of lost driver's licenses so they can apply for jobs. He directs people to resources and provides pastoral counseling. MARCH 28, 2023 NEWS UPDATE
