April Updates:

- The Idaho Falls Soup Kitchen served a total of:
 - o 3,727 meals during April. This number includes:
 - o 208 Children
 - o Adults: 2,643
 - o Rescue Centers: 876

Ongoing Projects & Updates

- Initial response to in-person dining
 - a. Our numbers have gone down slightly since starting in-person
 - b. Some of our guests are not happy about having to come in for meal service
 - c. Our teams have quickly adapted to in-person service
 - I have met with each team in the morning of their service to provide refresher training and support
 - d. We are now closed for in-person dining due to plumbing issues
- 2. Idaho Gives
 - a. The Soup Kitchen participated in the kick of event at the Museum with Mayor Casper
 - b. We received many generous donations
 - i. \$4.299.55 after fees
 - ii. \$500 check
 - iii. Donations continue to come in after the event

 - a. May 26th at 12PM at the Idaho Falls Public Library
 - b. Provide presentation about how the Soup Kitchen and SFSP operate
- 3. Grants
 - a. Sparklight
 - i. Community Outreach Center camera system upgrade
 - ii. Applied April 29 for \$7,274
 - iii. Community Outreach seems to be doing their own research as a guy was here doing a bid, so we might need to get on the same page
- 4. Donations
 - a. United Way 2022 Workplace Giving Campaign
 - i. Annual \$22,042.16. \$5,160.33 is ready to be disbursed now
 - ii. United way requests that we use a portion of this donation for a financial review so that they and other organizations can give to us in the future.
- Volunteers
 - a. Elders
 - i. We have completed inventory review including removing several items from TFAP inventory that have expired
 - ii. SK provided 4 elders with \$25 gift cards for their labor, this is a one time gift.
 - iii. SK filled the gas tank after over a month of using one of the elder's trucks to move inventory and go to the dump. \$86.26.
